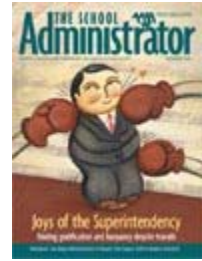


The School Administrator — Awards

AASA's monthly magazine, *The School Administrator*, has received several awards for editorial excellence in nationwide and regional publication competitions in the past several years.

Most recently, the magazine received the Award of Excellence, the top award designation, from the National School Public Relations Association for the December 2008 theme issue, *Joys of the Superintendency*.



The School Administrator previously received other honors from NSPRA. The magazine received the Award of Merit from the National School Public Relations Association for the February 2008 theme: Globalization and Education.

A leading disability rights organization, TASH, honored *The School Administrator* with its 2008 Positive Images in the Media Award for the magazine's coverage (September 2008) of educating students with disabilities in inclusive classroom settings.

The School Administrator earlier received NSPRA's Award of Excellence in the magazine category for its entry of the December 2006 issue, which focused on brain-friendly instructional policies and practices.



The School Administrator also picked up honors from NSPRA in the article-writing category for a column written by former AASA Executive Director Paul D. Houston, "Finding Our Voice," (November 2006).

The School Administrator took an award of honorable mention in the 2006 NSPRA contest in the theme issue category for its February 2006 issue, which carried a cover story titled "Smart Money."

Two other columns written by former AASA Executive Director Paul D. Houston. "Building Fields of Dreams" (April 2005) and "Einstein's Brain" (May 2005) were recognized among the top three entrants in the Central-Southeast Region in the staff columnist category for publications with a circulation of 80,000 or less in the American Society of Business Publication Editor's annual competition in 2006. "Building Fields of Dreams" also won the top honor, an Award of Excellence, in NSPRA's 2006 Publications and Electronic Media Contest.
