## DESIGN

Design learning experiences that are intentionally created and reflective of individual student strengths, needs, experiences, backgrounds, and perspectives.



## ENGAGE

Engage students in learning experiences that focus on rigorous, authentic, student-centered learning.



## ASSESS

Assess and monitor progress to provide timely feedback and inform instruction for all students.



## STUDENT-CENTERED

Center students in a community of belonging where each and every student is included, respected, and valued.



## REFLECT AND RESPOND

Reflect continuously by collecting and considering information, data, and feedback, and respond by making adjustments or taking appropriate actions.

 <p><b>DESIGN</b></p>	<p><b>When I design learning experiences for students, I:</b></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Focus on essential academic concepts and skills aligned with course expectations, Standards of Learning, and the LCPS Curriculum.</li> <li>Define clear, curriculum-based learning objectives that are communicated in student-friendly language.</li> <li>Select instructional strategies and resources that foster rigorous, authentic, and student-centered learning.</li> <li>Develop opportunities that promote flexible learning paths with appropriate scaffolds based on individual student strengths, needs, and/or interests.</li> </ul>	<p>What should students know and be able to do?</p> <p>How will I sequence and organize learning to build all students towards the learning objectives?</p> <p>How will I continuously assess student progress towards the learning objectives?</p>
 <p><b>ENGAGE</b></p>	<p><b>When I engage students in their learning, I:</b></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Facilitate opportunities for students to connect learning to their interests, backgrounds, lived experiences, or prior learning.</li> <li>Provide opportunities for students to develop knowledge and understanding through varied reading, writing, listening, and speaking activities.</li> <li>Utilize a variety of instructional approaches to meet the learning objectives and unique needs of students.</li> <li>Use intentional questioning, discussion, and collaboration to engage students in higher-level thinking and deepen understanding.</li> </ul>	<p>Which strategies will I choose to promote engagement?</p> <p>Which instructional approaches will I use to meet the unique needs of students?</p> <p>How is my instruction responsive to student needs based on evidence of learning?</p>
 <p><b>ASSESS</b></p>	<p><b>When I assess student learning, I:</b></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Communicate to students and families the characteristics of high-quality work and success criteria.</li> <li>Promote student ownership of learning through goal-setting, self-assessment, reflection, and revision.</li> <li>Integrate formative and summative assessments aligned with learning objectives and instruction to monitor student progress.</li> <li>Create rigorous and authentic opportunities for students to demonstrate and apply their learning in various ways.</li> </ul>	<p>What opportunities will students have to demonstrate their learning?
